According to the publisher, this thirty-one-volume set provides "in-depth analysis and informed advice on major elements of Colorado practice, rules, and procedure, including relevant forms."⁵ Covers topics such as civil, criminal, and appellate court practice; workers' compensation practice and procedure; personal injury, employment, real estate, water, and family law; estates and wills; and commercial transactions.

Pringle, *Colorado Law Annotated, 2d* (St. Paul, MN: West Publishing Co., 1991–present). Covers many aspects of Colorado law, including agency, attorney fees, automobiles, damages, death, dissolution of marriage, eminent domain, employer and employee, equity, fraudulent conveyances, governmental entities, guaranty, liens, limitations of actions, torts, real property, securities, civil procedure, insurance, criminal law and procedure, domestic relations, contracts, corporations, and more.⁶ Updated annually.

West's Colorado Law Finder (St. Paul, MN: West Pub. Co., 1993–present). Contains an alphabetical list of Colorado law topics. According to the publisher, this title "discusses texts, treatises, encyclopedias, state and federal statutes, court rules, form books, and digests."⁷ West topics and key numbers also are provided. Updated annually.

Colorado General Assembly website, available at www.leg.state.co.us. This is the home page for the Colorado state legislature. It includes both the Senate and House of Representatives. Use this site to find contact information for elected officials, updates on pending legislation, session laws, and general legislative resources.

Colorado State Judicial Branch website, available at www.courts.state.co.us. According to the site: “The Colorado Judicial Branch joins the Legislative and Executive branches to form the government for the State of Colorado. The Judicial Branch is charged with two responsibilities: resolving disputes and supervising offenders on probation. The Branch includes the Colorado Supreme Court, Colorado Court of Appeals, and district and county courts, served by 262 justices and judges in 22 judicial districts across the state (excluding 17 Denver county court judges). Municipal courts are not part of the state system.

There are also seven water courts, one in each of the major river basins." The site provides access to judicial performance reviews, the Colorado Code of Judicial Conduct, Rules of Court, and a self-help center containing court forms and instructions.

This site provides access to business information (including business organizations, names, and trademarks) and Uniform Commercial Code information through a searchable database. In addition, the "General Information" section provides links to listings of fees, publications, FAQs, a forms list, and a glossary of business terms.

Since 1953, the Legislative Council Staff has served as the nonpartisan research arm of the Colorado General Assembly. The staff serves under the direction of a Director of Research appointed by an eighteen-member legislative committee. The Legislative Council's role is to provide staff support to legislative committees, respond to requests for research and constituent services, prepare fiscal notes, provide revenue projections, and perform other centralized legislative support services. The full text of Legislative Council Issue Briefs since 1997 is available.

United States Courts for the District of Colorado website, available at www.cod.uscourts.gov. This official site contains court opinions for civil and criminal federal cases, as well as the bankruptcy court. Court opinions are kept for sixty days from the date of posting. Access to dockets and court documents are available through PACER. The court now requires court documents to be filed electronically. Current federal rules, forms, notices, and FAQs also are available.

U.S. Court of Appeals for the Tenth Circuit website, available at www.ca10.uscourts.gov. This site features the postings of Tenth Circuit Court of Appeals court opinions of general interest. This site also provides links to access to Tenth Circuit Court opinions via PACER (opinions in the past ninety days), Washburn University School of Law (opinions from October 1997 to present), and Emory Law School (opinions from August 1995 to October 1997). Also available is access to court rules, jury instructions, and biographical information on each judge.

The site contains information on Colorado lawyers, committees, Colorado Legal Education, and opinions of the Colorado Supreme Court and Court of Appeals. It also provides links to Colorado rules, ethics opinions, and statutes. The "Member Resources" section is password protected.⁸ The website provides member access to Casemaker, the legal research database of Colorado legal resources, including case law, statutes, rules, and articles printed in *The Colorado Lawyer* from November 1971.

Circuit Library, U.S. Court of Appeals for the Tenth Circuit, located in the Byron Rogers Federal Building in Denver, Colorado. This library is open to the public, but library items may be checked out only by federal judges and their staff. Visit the website at www.ck10.uscourts.gov/library.cfm.

Colorado Supreme Court Library, located in the State Judicial Building in Denver, Colorado. This library is open to the public, and serves the Colorado Supreme Court, the Colorado Court of Appeals, the state's district and county courts, and numerous state agencies. Visit the website at www.state.co.us/courts/sctlib. The library collection is searchable through the online "Library Catalog," but circulation of library materials is restricted to court personnel.

Law Library, University of Colorado School of Law, located in the Fleming Law Building at the University of Colorado in Boulder, Colorado. Visit the website at www.colorado.edu/Law/lawlib. The library collection is searchable through the online "LAWPAC" library catalog, and materials may be checked out by the general public. Selected legal Internet links are posted at the site.

Westminster Law Library, located at the University of Denver Sturm College of Law. The law library has limited access to the general public; the purchase of a day pass is required for entry, but does not entitle the holder to library borrowing privileges. Visit the website at www.law.du.edu/library/default.cfm. The library collection is accessible through the online "Library Catalog." The "Internet Research Links" link provides access to online resources and research guides on a variety of legal topics.
