## **Pikes Peak Library District's Law Collection**


Pikes Peak Library District's Law Collection consists of print volumes, law databases, and a law librarian. Originally founded to serve the El Paso County Bar Association (EPCBA), the law library moved from the courthouse to Penrose Library, the downtown public library branch, in 2002. It is now solely maintained by PPLD, with the mission to provide access to the law to the citizens of southern Colorado.

The collection includes reporters, codes, practice treatises, Nutshells and Nolo publications. PPLD subscribes to a Gale database of Colorado legal forms and Legal Information Reference Center, which contains Nolo ebooks and legal forms that can be searched by state. Westlaw Patron Access, available only at the downtown library, provides access to primary law plus journals and law reviews, treatises including the Restatements, and some sets that PPLD can no longer afford to update on the shelves. The Federal and Colorado digests, for example, are kept on the shelves as a teaching tool.

A significant part of the law librarian's job is hosting and teaching classes. The law librarian offers one-on-one sessions for patrons, teaches legal research classes for staff from around the district, and provides in-depth training to the Penrose staff who assist patrons with using the collection. PPLD brings in a West trainer to teach classes for the public and for paralegal students on how to use Westlaw, and a local volunteer attorney to teach Penrose's reference staff how the local court system operates and how attorneys approach legal research.

The PPLD Law Collection was previously the "Law Library," owned by a 501c3 organization, El Paso Bar Library, Inc., and managed by EPCBA's Law Library Committee. It was housed in the Colorado Springs courthouse until 2002, when the courthouse needed the space for other purposes. The Committee shopped around for a new space and entered into an agreement with PPLD. Staffed by a law clerk (funded by the bar) and

a law librarian (funded by PPLD after the move), the Law Library was jointly run by PPLD and the EPCBA, via the committee or a sole Law Library Liaison, for eight years. In late 2010, the bar association's president announced to the membership that the board no longer felt that books were necessary for legal research and that the law library was not an appropriate use of their dues. PPLD's directors felt it was important to continue to make the law accessible to residents in southern Colorado, so PPLD retained most of the print collection and continued to fund public Westlaw access.



The library has been increasing outreach to organizations in the local legal community over the last two years. Tours, classes, and one-on-one sessions are provided to the paralegal students at Pikes Peak Community College through a relationship with the paralegal program's student association. The courthouse's new Self Represented Litigant Coordinators presented on their services to library staff, attend law-related library programs, and are proving to be a valuable resources for reference questions about court procedure. The Adult Services department is currently exploring avenues to build relationships with the Clerk of the Court's office and other local agencies.

## CU Law Library Launches Colorado Session Laws Digital Collection

With the start of the 2014 Colorado Legislative Session, the William A. Wise Law Library has made available its newest digital collection, the Colorado Session Laws. The University of Colorado law library contains a complete collection of official Colorado Session Law volumes dating from 1861 through the most recent legislative session. The law library is in the process of digitizing these session law volumes with permission from the State of Colorado. These documents are available in the pdf file format and are full text searchable.

Researchers may find session laws using a variety of search options.

1. On the Basic search tab, researchers can quickly find a session law using the year and chapter or page number of the act.
2. On the Basic search tab, researchers can also retrieve any part of the session law volume for a single year or spanning multiple years using the Document Type option.
3. On the Advanced search tab, researchers can locate session law documents by Title.
4. The law library has also captured the index entries for each session law. Researchers can use the Index Subject field to search for all session laws categorized under that Index Subject entry.
5. Finally, on the Advanced search tab, researchers can search the full text of the session laws using keywords. This search will take the researcher to the law library's online repository where the digital copies of the session law volumes are stored.

In its initial release, the law library is making available the Territorial Session Laws from 1861 through 1876. In the coming months, we will add session laws through 1992 to the collection. We hope that researchers will find the collection both easy to use for simple searches and yet offer advanced search options to explore these documents in new ways.

**September 2013 Update**

The CoALL renewal drive has officially ended, but membership numbers are lower than expected. Whereas we ended the renewal drive with 94 Active, Associate, and Student members, we currently have only 76 Active, Associate, and Student members. About 5-6 others have promised that their renewals are on their way, but that still leaves membership significantly lower than in the past.

Membership for the 2012-2013 year is as follows:

Associate Members	<b>8</b> (13 in June)
Individual Members	<b>15</b> (20 in June)
Institutional Members	<b>48</b> (56 in June)
Student Members	<b>5</b> (19 in June)
Lifetime Members	<b>7</b>

This indicates that the decrease in members is fairly even amongst the different member types and not isolated to one type.

The committee was focused on obtaining as many renewals as possible. During the renewal drive, I sent out emails at regular intervals and emailed and called members individually. Unfortunately, there were some members that had left the area, some that changed their contact information and did not inform us, and some that specifically told me that they did not intend to renew. One of the reasons that some members gave was that they just weren't involved as they wanted to be and didn't see that changing.

At this point, one of the focuses of the committee will have to become new member recruitment. Perhaps some other members would be willing to join the membership committee or at least work with me to brainstorm ways to recruit new members. The happy hour with the students on September 19 will help to recruit student members, but the committee needs to do more in order to meet the membership goals this year.
